Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2011/12	
<p>The school has focused its additional support in accelerating progress in phonics in KS1 and on accelerating progress in writing and numeracy in all Key Stages.</p> <p>School has invested in a better quality of library books to support the reading interests of all children.</p>	

We have purchased additional ICT equipment to enable children to develop key skills in engaging, exciting ways.

We have further developed our teaching of phonics and reading skills by purchasing additional phonics and reading resources within the Phonics Matched Funding scheme.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The amount of pupils receiving PPG in each cohort is very small.

In May 2012 71.4% of Year 1 pupils achieved a pass in the Year 1 Phonics check, including all pupils receiving PPG.

By the end of KS2 - of the pupils receiving PPG:

11.1% (2) of the pupils in the cohort were eligible for free school meals (FSM). Of these 100% (2 pupils) achieved a level 4+ in both English and Maths.

Of these 100% (2 pupils) made 2 or more levels of progress in both English and Maths.

16.7% (3) of the pupils in the cohort are eligible for free school meals or are children who are looked after. (FSM & LAC) - of these 100% (3 pupils) achieved a level 4+ in both English and Maths.

Service Children - one child in this cohort was supported by PPG - made 2 levels of progress in both English and Maths and achieved Level 4. Our service children are not under achieving compared to their peers, but the premium is provided in recognition of the support that may be needed by pastoral issues.

Internal assessment data identified that across all Key Stages, pupils receiving PPG as a group made at least good progress or better in English and Mathematics and made similar progress to pupils who were not receiving PPG.
