- Financial support made available to students from families whose circumstances are particularly challenging, so they can participate fully in the range of school activities and trips

Measuring the impact of PPG spending (How will Parents/carers know the money is having an impact?)

We track all pupils' progress every half term, so that we can quickly see if the plans put into place for a child are working. We will report your child's progress to you at parent's evening, and in the end of year report to parents, but if you would like any information on your child's progress at any time, please speak in the first instance to their class teacher.

The amount of pupils receiving PPG in each cohort is very small.

In June 2014, 69.2% of Year 1 pupils achieved a pass in the Year 1 Phonics check, including 5 out of the 7 pupils receiving PPG.

There were 11 pupils at the end of Key Stage 2. Of these, 2 (18%) were eligible for free school meals

Of these 100% (2 pupils) achieved a level 4+ in Reading, Writing, Grammar Punctuation and Spelling and Maths.

Service Children- We have currently three service children in school. All children have achieved a good level of development. Our service children are not under achieving compared to their peers, but the premium is provided in recognition of the support that may be needed by pastoral issues.

Internal assessment data identified that across all Key Stages, Pupils receiving PPG as a group made at least good progress or better in English and Mathematics and made similar progress to pupils who were not receiving PPG.
