
As February approaches, we will learn about the festival of Chinese New Year and will listen to Chinese dragon music and make dragon crafts.

Library Books

Helping at Home

- Read/share a book with your child every evening for a few minutes.
- Practice holding a pencil.
- Practice counting count the stairs you climb/the plates at tea time.
- ❖ Talk to her/him about their day at Nursery. A good way of getting something out of your child is to ask the guestion: What was the best thing about today?
- Encourage independent skills, e.g. toileting, putting on and fastening their own coat, putting their things on their own peg.
